










Deep & Wide Engagement:

Volunteer Programme








Plan for the Common: 2019 - 2030

- Worked closely with Council officers to develop a draft plan.
- Consulted with our friends on an early view.
- SCC conducted further online citizen engagement;
 - 842 respondents
 - Very positive feedback
- Approved by SCC Cabinet December 2018
- Challenge is to implement it!







Study of Green Travel on the Common

- Conducting survey of Common commuters (closes 2nd March).
- Conducting census of pedestrians and cyclists on Common.

 We will publish a comprehensive report on Green Travel that will inform implementation of the plan.









Lovers Walk Planning Application

- SCF, jointly with UoS and SCC, facilitating stakeholders and users to find common ground on pending Lovers Walk Planning Application.
- Informal process of mediation outside planning process.
- Early April one day workshop.
- Professional facilitation with Turnberry planning consultants.
- Report in public domain by May.
